

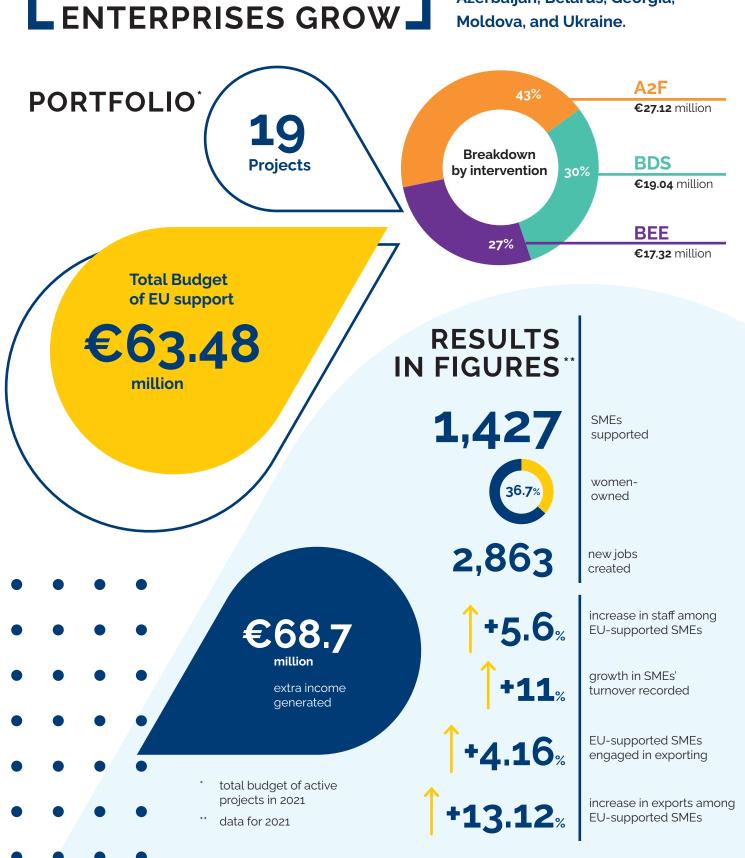

WHAT SUPPORT DOES THE EU PROVIDE TO SMES?

Access to Finance (A2F):

- concessionary loans via national banks
- micro financing for household businesses
- small grants to SMEs
- training staff at national banks to better serve SMEs
- + training SMEs in financial literacy

Business Development Services (BDS):

- providing direct advice and training to SMEs
- training and capacity-building among national business support organisations (BSOs)
- establishing business incubators for start-ups
- developing business clusters for mutual support and development
- supporting governments in identifying new markets
- building capacities at export support organisations

Business Enabling Environment (BEE):

- promoting regulatory reform and best practice
- building capacity amongst policy makers and regulators
- encouraging public-private dialogue
- informing business about reform processes and rules/procedures

Premium brands sew clothes in Belarus: "Knitwear is pure magic!"

Bonadi – a knitwear factory in Belarus set up in 2014 – has partnered with luxury clothing brands through the EU4Business "Ready to Trade" project. The company worked with a consultant from the Netherlands who audited everything what might be improved. In 2021, Bonadi became an exhibitor at Première Vision. The project also helped the factory with offline and online consultations in various areas. As a result, Bonadi has increased production by 10-15%, and online sales in 2021 alone increased by 45%.

In addition to her family vegetable farming business in Homiel Region, Yulia Molochko works actively with the local Eco-Innovation Fund for the support of entrepreneurship and rural development facilitated by UNDP under the EU4Business Initiative. Yulia is helping residents of Brahin County to grow grains, to engage in dairy farming, and cheese-making on a level that will generate income and allow them to live a decent life. She also coordinates efforts to establish an internet shop in which county residents will be able to sell and buy fresh produce: corn, tomatoes, cheese, milk, honey, and much more.

Her Nadezhnoe Farm became a partner of the Berry Land Cluster Initiative and received help from the EU4Business project implemented by UNDP. Thanks to the project, Nadezhda says she understood that they had to give up uncompetitive vegetables and switch to berries due to the increase in the average temperatures.

Belarus is moving to online business services with EU help

Currently only 6% of all administrative procedures related to doing business in Belarus can be carried out online. To complete the remaining 94%, Belarusian firms have to physically visit various government agencies. Not only does this mean additional expenses, it also increases the burden on healthcare services during the pandemic. The EU4Business project implemented by the International Finance Corporation is helping Belarus convert the majority of these procedures into electronic format.

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
